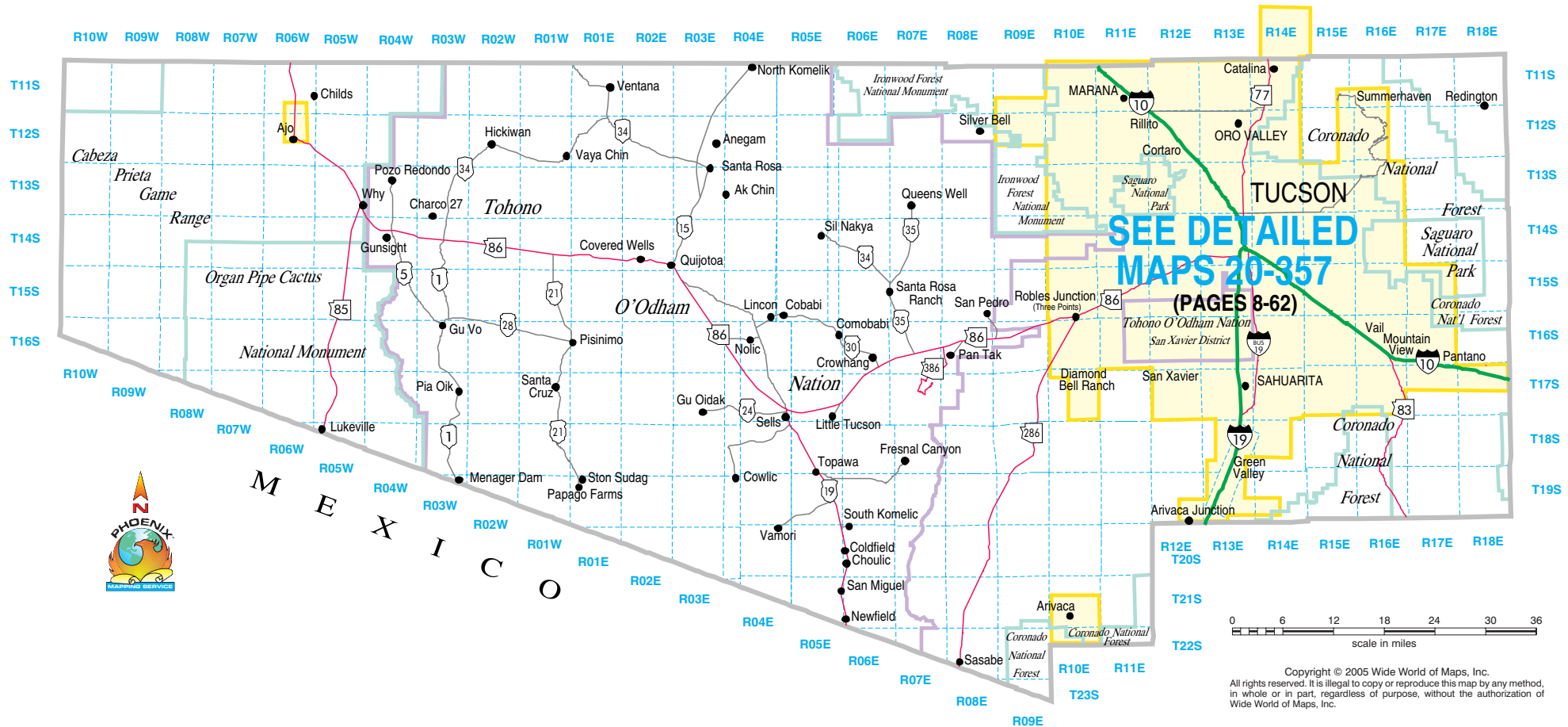


# PIMA COUNTY AREA MAP

Pima County, founded November 8, 1864, is one of Arizona's original four counties. It derives its name from the Pima Indians. Privately owned land makes up fourteen percent of the county, Indian lands forty-two percent, and the remaining forty-four percent is owned by state and federal governments. Tucson is the county seat and the second largest city in the state.

Geographically, the county occupies the high Sonoran Desert. Rugged Mountains, gentle rolling hills and clear blue skies create unmatched natural beauty and climate. This landscape is home to a wide variety of animals and plants unique to the Sonoran Desert of Northern Mexico and Southern Arizona.
